- 47 crew members enrolled
- 3,912 hours of field work
- 20 partner collaborations
- 50 miles of trails maintained
- 11,800 cubic feet of noxious weeds removed

### **IN SUMMARY**

2024 marks the 17th year since YCC first started on Lopez Island, and its 8th year as a countywide program operating under the San Juan Islands Conservation District. Each year, YCC continues to provide a sense of community for youth, engaging middle school-aged crew members in gratifying hands-on environmental stewardship projects embedded with outdoor education and professional development skill-building activities

During the summer season, a total of 47 crew members between the ages of 12-18 participated in the YCC program. The crews cumulatively contributed 3,572 hours of stewardship activities, environmental education lessons, and work projects throughout public lands and waters in San Juan County.
